

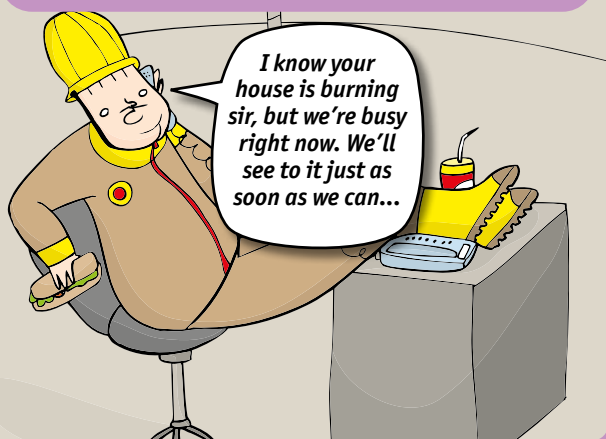
PHRASAL VERBS TO SEE

The verb "to see" has many different uses. However, we generally use this verb in reference to observing something. For example, "I saw Frank in the park." Now let's look at some phrasal verbs with the verb "to see".

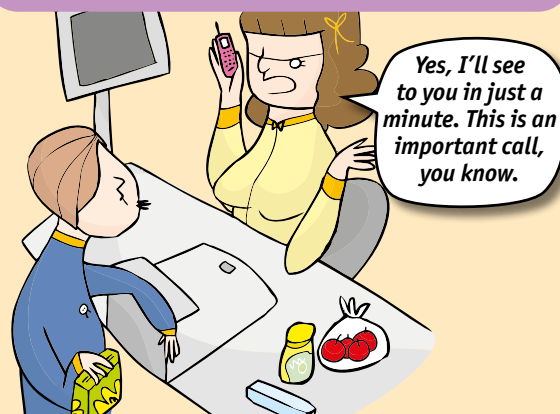
See to something

To deal with something; to find a solution to a problem.



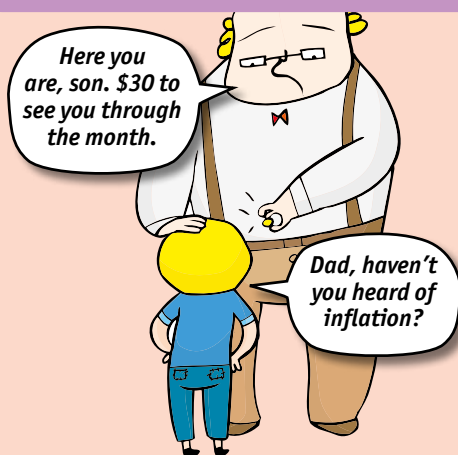
See to someone (in a shop, etc)

To deal with someone in a shop; to attend to someone in a shop.



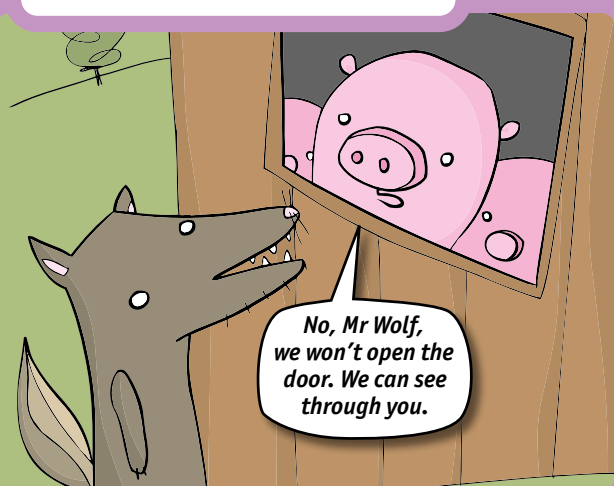
See you through (money)

To have enough money to buy everything you need.



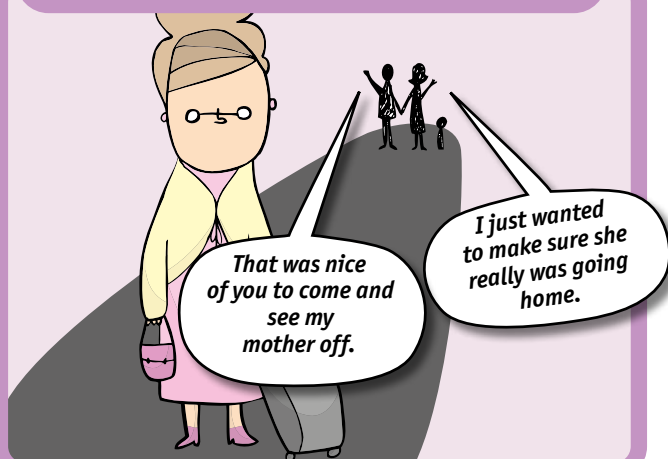
See through someone

To understand someone's true intentions.



See someone off (before going on a journey)

To accompany someone to the airport/port/train station, in order to say goodbye to them.



See someone out (of a room, etc)

To accompany someone as they leave a room, etc.
