'Th' sounds

Th has two pronunciations in English, voiced $/\delta$ / and unvoiced $/\theta$ /. In both cases, the tongue tip touches gently behind the top front teeth. The air comes out in between the tongue tip and the top teeth. For unvoiced *th*, like in the words *think* and *thank* there is no voice. For voiced *th* like in the words *that* and *this*, there is vibration from the voice box.
