## Pronunciation and Intonation Assimilation of /t/ followed by /k/

In fluent speech, when one word ends in a vowel sound followed by a /t/ and the next word begins with a /k/, the /t/ changes to a /k/. So /kredit ka:rd/ becomes /kredik ka:rd/. It's an example of assimilation. And here are some more examples. Listen to them carefully and try to repeat what you hear:

Don't let it get cold! You have to do it quickly. I didn't like that cake.
