Pronunciation and Intonation **♥** Assimilation: /d/ + /j/

In fluent speech when one word ends in a vowel sound then /d/ sound and the next word begins in a /j/ sound, the two sounds come together and change to a /dʒ/ sound. So 'would you' becomes 'woul/dʒ/ou', or even 'woul/dʒ/o'. This is an example of assimilation. Here are some more examples:

I'm sa**d y**ou decided to quit. I'm sa/**dz**/ou decided to quit.

Coul**d** you get here by midnight? Coul/**d**y/ou get here by midnight?

Shoul**d y**ou see him, can you give him a message? Shoul/**dy**/ou see him, can you give him a message?

I don't think the gol**d y**ou bought was real. I don't think the gol/**dy**/ou bought was real.
