Reduction of to

The word *to* is usually pronounced very quickly, with a /tə/ sound. For example: *She decided <u>to</u> leave college. /tə/*

In some common expressions, *to* links to the previous word and the /t/ sound is not pronounced. For example:

She is going to stay with friends. /gənə/

However, when *to* begins or ends a sentence, or when the speaker wants to emphasize it, *to* has a long vowel /tu/ sound. For example: She says she doesn't know how <u>to</u>. /tu/
