Many performances take place throughout Madrid, including the attractions of *Café de Chinitas* and *Casa Patas*.

Also, the markets, including the *Mercado de San Miguel* are some of the most desired destinations in Madrid, where many people are **tempted** by a sweet **delight**, the renowned *chocolate con churros*.
